Course Outline

The two years Masters program includes compulsory and elective courses held in the evening. To receive the degree, students must complete 33 credit hours. The core courses include:

- History of the United States
- American Philosophy and Literature
- American Political System
- American Economic System
- American Foreign Policy
- Research Methods

Admission Information and Requirements

Students are admitted at the beginning of each academic year, which usually starts in September. The main admission requirements are:

- A bachelor's degree in a relevant field.

- English Language Proficiency demonstrated by a score of at least 3.5 on the IELTS test, 400 on the TOEFL paper test, or 32 on the TOEFL IBT test.
